Messaggio del Presidente - George Golfieri

Cari Amici,

What a start to the new year, over a month of much needed rain, but just too much all at once. I hope members came through the storm unscathed. The Italian Cultural Center did have some damage as a result of the storms. There is a leak on the roof that resulted in damage to the second-floor ceiling. We are working with the insurance company and hopefully the Foundation's insurance will cover some of the costs. We will follow up with further information.

There is an Italian saying:

"Il detto, se marzo entre come un leone, esce come un agnello, ha le radici nell' essenza stessa del mese, che comincia con tempo invernale feroce per poi passare al clima piu mite della primavera."

March enters like a lion, it goes out like a lamb, has its roots in the very essence of the month which begins with ferocious winter weather and then moves on to the milder climate of spring.

Financially, the Foundation ended 2022 with \$47,032 in the bank and had a profit for 2022 of \$10,845. However, much of this profit was the result of Welfare Property tax refund of \$16,149 received in June.

The Foundation generates the majority of its income from membership dues, donations, dinners, and fundraisers. These sources of income help support the scholarship programs, cultural events and to cover operating expenses. This is our heritage that binds us together as Italian Americans and to further the Foundation's commitment to the North Bay Italian community.

I am pleased to announce the recipients of **The Sharie Sbrazza NBICF Florence Study Abroad Scholarship** for the 2023 spring semester. Congratulations to **Brianne Cardle, Cristian Ramirez**, and **Olivia Wagner**. This scholarship is awarded each spring to students furthering their education as part of SRJC's study abroad program in Italy. Each recipient receives a \$1,000 scholarship.

In 1996 NBICF and the Santa Rosa Junior College established the **Marianne Pedroncelli scholarship**. This scholarship awards \$450 each spring to students with a major in Italian Studies. Also, in 2014 NBICF and the Santa Rosa Junior College established the **Bill and Jeanette Mitchell Scholarship**. This scholarship awards \$900 each spring to students pursuing a career in teaching or Italian related studies.

Since its inception, the Foundation has awarded over \$129,525 in scholarships for Italian studies at SRJC.

La Festa della Donna, (sometimes called La Festa delle Donne) is a celebration of women. La Festa della Donna is Italy's celebration of International Women's Day,

recognized by the United Nations and many countries around the world.

The first National Woman's Day was held in New York, on February 28, 1909. The date was changed from the last Sunday of February (the 23rd), to March 8th, because Russia hadn't yet adopted the Gregorian calendar. February 23rd, s corresponding date in the Gregorian calendar is March 8th. Italy first celebrated the holiday in 1922. The tradition of giving out yellow mimosa (aka acacia) flowers dates back to 1946. They are found throughout Italy and not as expensive as other flowers. (Various websites)
