The recipients of these scholarships will be announced in late August. NBICF has granted 308 scholarships to deserving SRJC students since 1989 for a total of \$131,350. I would like to thank the scholarship committee, Gino Muzzatti chair, Virginia Kelley, and Emily Evans for their hard work in reviewing scholarship applications.

The North Bay Italian Cultural Foundation hereinafter referred to as "NBICF" is a California non-profit, 501c3 organization, located at 64 Brookwood Avenue, Santa Rosa, CA 95404, telephone 707-591-9696. These rules govern the raffle and, by purchasing a raffle ticket, you agree to be bound by these rules.

1. You must be 18 years or older in order to purchase a raffle ticket.

2. The price of the raffle ticket is \$25.00. If your check is dishonored by the financial institution, the entry ticket will be invalid unless full payment is received by NBICF prior to the time of the drawing.

3. No more than 750 tickets will be sold. All tickets will be recorded in the order received. Original raffle ticket is required to redeem prize.

4. The winner will be determined by random drawing. The drawing will take place at NBICF's Festa di Natale dinner in December 2023. If NBICF has not received full payment for all 750 raffle tickets by the raffle time, NBICF may, at its sole and absolute discretion, delay the drawing until all 750 tickets have been purchased.

5. Three prizes are offered. The first prize is a 10-day trip for 2 to Tuscany, Italy. The first prize includes airfare, lodging, and transportation. All travel arrangements will be made through an independent travel agency. Travel will be in the fall of 2024.
