November Board Elections

The NBICF Board of Directors is composed of 13 members each serving a two-year term. In order to maintain continuity, staggered two-year terms have been established; that is, six are elected one year and the other seven are elected the next year.

In November there will be six positions open for a two-year term (2024 and 2025). Of these six (Allen Barbieri, George Golfieri, Al Pucci, Don Raimondi, Les Villanyi, Virginia Smith) all, except Al Pucci, have decided to run for another two-year term. Thus, there will be one vacant position and five positions with incumbents seeking another two-year term. Of the seven directors who have one more year (2024) remaining, Linda Apel has chosen to resign. So, there will be one vacant position open for the second year of Linda's term; that is, calendar 2024.

Once again, we will be holding the election using on-line technology as was done last year but will also mail the ballots to those who do not have access to a computer. Alfred (Al) Pucci

Eyeglasses. Who invented them? The Romans were the first to learned how to employ glass to improve vision of small print and made magnifying glasses. The first pair of corrective spectacles was created in Italy between 1268 and 1300 in Venice. Proof comes from a Venetian document in 1284 which provides the earliest known description of glasses: It specified that **"Roidi da Ogli" (Glasses for Eyes)** to be made of pure crystal. However, the man who apparently made glasses popular was a Dominican friar named Giordano Da Pisa who encountered Venetian monks during a stay at a monastery in Bologna. It was these Venetians who crafted glasses in their monastery near the church of San Giacometto in Rialto.
