The Pasta Strainer

Every Italian kitchen has one of these or should have one of the most important utensils, the pasta strainer or **"scolapasta".** Of course, it was invented in Italy, but unlike many other national inventions, there is no precise name or exact time to associate with it.

The earliest forms of the colanders or strainers are believed to have emerged from culinary practices of ancient Rome where they were utilized in wine making to process grapes.

If you want to find any historical reference to a pasta strainer, you need to go back to the year 1363 during the Renaissance, when a utensil called *caza lasagnaria* was used in Genova for straining their popular trenette and spaghetti dishes. However, it wasn't until 1570 that **Bartolomeo Scappi**, cook to the papal elite, immortalized the pasta strainer in his book *Opera Dell Arte Del Cucinare*, in what he termed the *foratoro*.

Over the years, the pasta strainer has evolved into the iconic hemispherical form, a design that remains a symbol of Italian culinary culture.


