Panettone is a Christmastime cake from Milan. The sweet, yeasty cake has a distinctive domed shape. Panettone is often compared to fruitcake because both are traditionally made with raisins and candied fruits.

Pandoro is a Christmas cake that originated in Verona. True to its name (*pan d'oro* means "golden bread"), the cake has a bright yellow color. Pandoro is traditionally a star-shaped cake that is dusted with powdered sugar.

In Italy, no Christmas meal is complete without either panettone or pandoro, but often both. It is a real dilemma in many Italian families, often split between panettone lovers and pandoro lovers. The first group finds pandoro to be too simple and buttery; the second group usually dislikes raisins and candied fruits which abound in traditional panettone. More often than not, you buy both.

Christmas in Italy

Starting December 8, many Italians begin putting their Christmas trees up and they remove them at the end of the Christmas season, January 6.

During this time, Nativity scenes, *Presepi*, start to appear in churches, town squares, and homes. The nativity scene with a crib filled with straw, originally stems from Italy and is now common in many countries around the world. It is said that the crib scene was first used by Francis of Assisi in 1223. Naples has the largest nativity scene in the world with over 600 objects on it.



On Christmas Eve, it's common that no meat is eaten. The Feast of the Seven Fishes (**Festa dei Sette Pesci**), is a popular meal. On Christmas Day, **Babbo Natale** (Santa Claus) might bring

children some small gifts, but the main day for present giving is on the Epiphany, January 6. Children believe that an old witch called **Befana** brings presents for them.

However, depending on the area you are from, gift giving varies. Generally speaking, in the south of Italy people tend to celebrate more on Christmas Eve, with dinner and opening of gifts at midnight. While in the north they tend to celebrate more on actual Christmas Day, and open gifts on Christmas morning.

No matter when you open your gifts, a common factor for all is food and lots of it!

On December 26th, lunch continues the festivities. The meal isn't as indulgent as Christmas lunch, but just as well composed. Restaurants are very popular this day too.
